New for 2018, we are introducing Tuesday Talks to the Gardens which will focus on the heritage and history of Spetchley Park and its gardens. Talks will also include the Berkeley Family who have owned the gardens for over four hundred years.

These talks are just for Friends of Spetchley Park Gardens (although members of the public may be invited to certain talks if they receive limited interest).

Talks will be held by our archivist Karen Davidson who manages the archives at both Spetchley Park Gardens and our sister site, Berkeley Castle, in Gloucestershire.

Talks will include objects from our archives, some of which have been previously unseen by the public and may include photographs, letters and other artefacts.

All talks cost £3.50 per person and will be held in our Learning Centre from 2.30pm on select Tuesdays. Free tea and coffee is available on arrival.
